WASHINGTON (UPI)-The House Space Committee Monday sought to learn how soon -if ever-man may be able to wage war by changing the grams, weather.

The theory of using weather as a weapon of war is simply this:

Weather modification is still in its infancy. However, some experts have said that progress could be speeded up considerably by financing new and broader research pro.

American experts stress that the potentialities of weather control for peace are even greater than for war.
